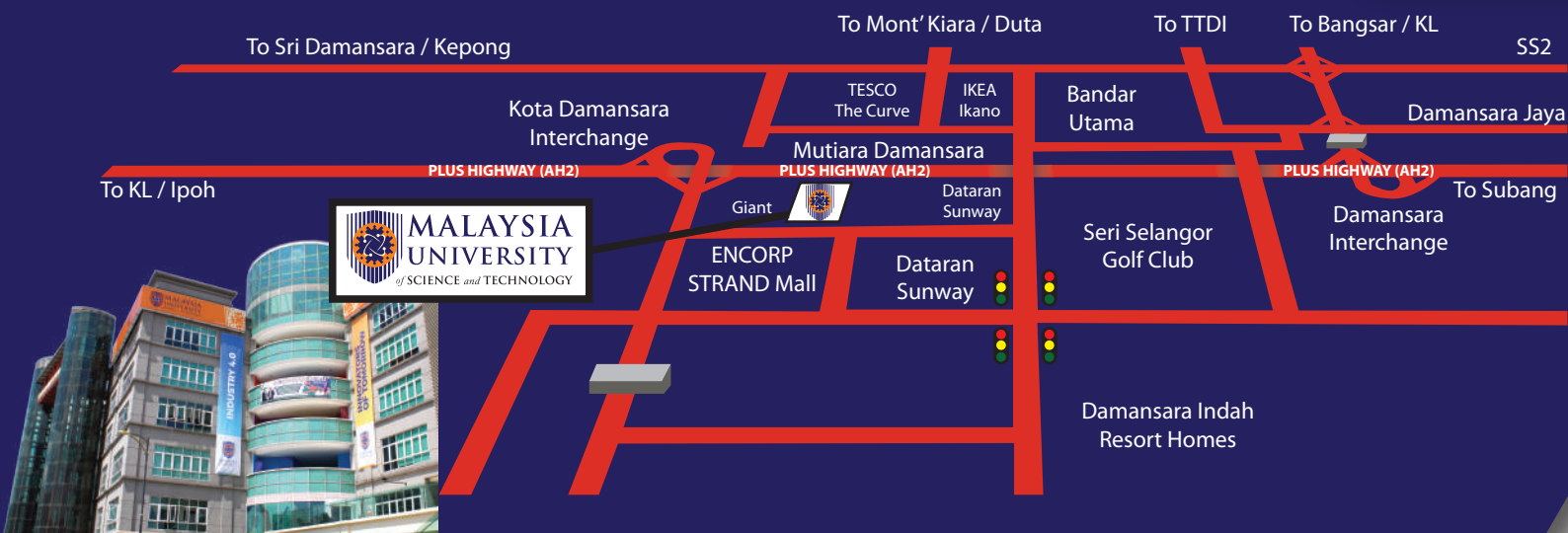

Entry Requirements

 - A Diploma (Level 4, MQF) with at least CGPA of 2.00; OR
 - An Advanced Diploma (Level 5, MQF) with at least CGPA of 2.00; OR
 - A Diploma Kemahiran Malaysia (DKM) /Diploma Vokasional Malaysia (DVM) subjected to HEP Senate / Academic Board's approval; OR
 - A Diploma Lanjutan Kemahiran Malaysia (DLKM) subjected to HEP Senate /Academic Board's approval; OR
 - Other equivalent qualifications recognised by the Malaysian Government.
 - ENGLISH COMPETENCY REQUIREMENT (INTERNATIONAL STUDENT)
 - Achieve a minimum Band 3 in MUET OR equivalent to CEFR (Low B2)**..
- *Additional requirement: A pass in Mathematics and English at SPM level or equivalent qualifications. Those without a pass in Mathematics and/or English at SPM level or equivalent can be admitted but are required to attend special enhancement course(s)
